

QUALIFICATIONS FOR DIRECTOR OF STEPHENS REGIONAL SPECIAL UTILITY DISTRICT

You must be a resident citizen of the State of Texas, and at least eighteen (18) years of age, and either own land located within the boundaries of the Stephens Regional Special Utility District or a user of the facilities of the District or a qualified voter of the District.

In addition, be aware of the provisions relating to disqualification of members of the governing boards of districts as set forth by act of the Texas Legislature under Section 49.052. Texas Water Code, and which provisions recite, in part, as follows:

1. **A person is disqualified from serving as a member of a governing board of a district ... if:**
 - (a) they are related within the third degree of affinity or consanguinity to a developer of property in the district, any member of the governing board of the district or the manager, engineer, attorney or other person providing professional services to the district;
 - (b) they are an employee of any developer of property in the district or any director, manager, engineer, attorney, or other person providing professional services to the district or a developer of property in the district in connection with the district or property located in the district;
 - (c) they are a developer of property in the district;
 - (d) they are serving as an attorney, consultant, engineer, manager, architect, or in some other professional capacity for the district or a developer of property in the district in connection with the district or property located in the district;
 - (e) they are:
 - (i) a party to a contract with or along with the district, except for the purchase of public services furnished by the district to the public generally; or,
 - (ii) a party to a contract with or along with a developer of property in the district relating to the district or to property within the district, other than a contract limited solely to the purpose of purchasing or conveying real property in the district for the purpose of either establishing a permanent residence, establishing a commercial business within the district, or qualifying as a director; or
 - (f) during the term of office, fails to maintain the qualifications required by law to serve as a director.
